#### » First Cause: Vigilantes

- Since statehood in 1907, Oklahoma had seen ~30 lynching's (hangings / burn at the stake / shooting)
- Of those, 26 were of African American descent.
- Others were common criminals or 'undesirables'.



- so Second Cause: Segregation
  - During this time, remember segregation laws are being passed like crazy.
  - In Tulsa, most of the 'well-off' white families had African American domestic help (butlers, housemaids, cooks, etc.)
  - There were also segregated businesses, schools, etc.



- so Third Cause: The KKK Influence
  - Tulsa had a very active Klan presence.
  - Remember, in the 'South', this organization seemed very respectable and necessary... to those who were involved.



- Fourth Cause: Black Prosperity
  - By the 1920's, 'Greenwood' (street / area to the East of ONEOK Field) was a very prosperous African American community.
  - A 'White' Tulsa + Oil Money = "The Magic City".
  - $_{\circ}$  Segregation  $\rightarrow$  Black Prosperity
    - "The Black Wall Street"
      - Grocery Stores, Churches, Businesses, etc. all formed into this community of 'Greenwood'.

- 🔊 "Diamond Dick", Dick Rowland
  - Age: 19
  - Race: African American
  - Occupation: Shoe shiner
- 🔊 Sarah Page
  - Age: 17
  - Race: Caucasian
  - Occupation: Elevator Operator Drexel Building
- 🔊 What Happened?

- ∞ Tuesday, May 31, 1921→ Wed. June 1 The Event
- » "Diamond Dick" is arrested and taken into custody.
- The word gets out... People start talking (including The Tulsa Tribune or as we know it now, The Tulsa World)
- so "To Lynch Negro Tonight"



- ∞ Tuesday, May 31, 1921 → Wed. June 1<sup>st</sup> The Event
- so Angry whites start gathering at the courthouse.
- so Armed blacks start gathering to protect Dick Rowland.
- The sheriff is able to barricade the fourth floor, to hopefully calm the crowd.

- so Tuesday, May 31, 1921  $\rightarrow$  Wed. June 1<sup>st</sup> The Event
- So From mid-afternoon → nightfall, things are able to be kept under control.
- ∞ Then... It gets real...
  - 10:00 PM Tuesday, May 31, 1921
  - A 'disagreement' between a white and black man leads to shots being fired.
  - This 'kicks-off' the riot and several are killed.

- so Tuesday, May 31, 1921  $\rightarrow$  Wed. June 1<sup>st</sup> The Event
- 🔊 African Americans protect families / houses.
- » Whites let's do whatever we have to do.
  - Broke into stores for weapons.
  - Many were 'deputized' to 'protect' Tulsa.
  - Headed for Greenwood to take care of business.

## **DURING / AFTER THE RIOT**









- Property Damage approx. \$1.5 Million (in 1921)
- Approx. 1200 homes were destroyed
- so Approx. 300 were looted, not burned
- So The Black Wall Street or 'Greenwood' destroyed
- Number of Casualties?
  Estimated: 36; Injured: ~800.
  (Official Count?)
